

**FIRE OPERATIONS IN THE
WILDLAND/URBAN INTERFACE**

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to assist wildland and structure firefighters who will be making tactical decisions when confronting wildland fire that threatens life, property, and improvements, in the wildland/urban interface. Instructional units include: Interface Awareness, Size up, Initial Strategy and Action Plan, Structure Triage, Tactics, Action Plan, Assessment, Public Relations and Follow up, and Safety. This course is presented in a classroom.

OBJECTIVES

Identify safe and effective strategy and tactics to minimize harm presented by wildland fire to the urban interface.

TARGET GROUP

Wildland: Incident Commander Type 4 (ICT4), Strike Team Leader (STL)

Structure: Engine Operators, Chief or Company Officers with protection duties in interface areas.

TRAINEE PREREQUISITES

Wildland: FFT1 Qualified

Structure: Completion of Basic Fire School + S-131

Students must have basic knowledge of structure & wildland firefighter operations. They must also be familiar with and understand their agency policy as it relates to interface fires.
