

**FIRE OPERATIONS IN THE  
WILDLAND/URBAN INTERFACE**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is designed to assist wildland and structure firefighters who will be making tactical decisions when confronting wildland fire that threatens life, property, and improvements, in the wildland/urban interface. Instructional units include: Interface Awareness, Size up, Initial Strategy and Action Plan, Structure Triage, Tactics, Action Plan, Assessment, Public Relations and Follow up, and Safety.

**OBJECTIVES**

Gain knowledge to size-up a wildland/urban interface fire incident, evaluate the potential situation, order and deploy the necessary resources and apply safe and effective strategy and tactics to minimize harm in the wildland fire to the urban interface.

**TARGET GROUP**

Wildland: Incident Commander Type 4 (ICT4), Strike Team Leader (STL)

Structure: Engine Operators, Chief or Company Officers with protection duties in interface areas.

**TRAINEE PREREQUISITES**

Wildland: FFT1 Qualified

Structure: Completion of Basic Fire School (I-100, L-180, S-130, S-190) and Firefighter Type 1: S-131

Students must have basic knowledge of structure & wildland firefighter operations. Students must be knowledgeable of their agency firefighting policy as it relates to wildland/urban interface fires.
